Confirmation is a sacramental outpouring of the Holy Spirit that leaves a permanent imprint on the soul, completes Christian initiation, and empowers us to be witnesses to Christ (CCC 1302-1305). Confirmation is necessary for the completion of baptismal grace (CCC 1285).

Five effects of Confirmation: -It affirms our identity as children of God. -Unites us more firmly to Christ. -It increases in us the Gifts of the Holy Spirit. -It strengthens our bond with the Church. -It strengthens us to spread and defend the Faith by our words and actions, to be fearless witnesses to Christ and the power of the cross (CCC 1303).

Why do you, personally, want to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation?

<u>Sponsor</u>

Your Sponsor should: 1) Assist you (the candidate) in preparing for Confirmation. 2) Present you for Confirmation. 3) After being confirmed, help you live out your Christian faith fully.

HOLY SPIRIT

The Holy Spirit descended upon the Apostles on Pentecost, giving them courage to practice their faith. The effect of the sacrament of Confirmation is the special outpouring of the Holy Spirit as once granted to the apostles on the day of Pentecost.

When the time for Pentecost was fulfilled, they were all in one place together. And suddenly there came from the sky a noise like a strong driving wind, and it filled the entire house in which they were. Then there appeared to them tongues as of fire, which parted and came to rest on each one of them. And they were all filled with the holy Spirit and began to speak in different tongues, as the Spirit enabled them to proclaim. Acts 2:1-4

The Gifts of the Spirit make it possible for us to live and act as the Holy Spirit leads us.

Wisdom helps us recognize the importance of others and the importance of keeping God central in our lives.

Understanding is the ability to comprehend the meaning of God's message.

Knowledge is the ability to think about and explore God's revelation, and also to recognize that there are mysteries of faith beyond us.

Counsel is the ability to see the best way to follow God's plan when we have choices that relate to him.

Fortitude is the courage to do what one knows is right.

Piety helps us pray to God in true devotion.

Fear of the Lord is the feeling of amazement before God, who is all-present, and whose friendship we do not want to lose.

THE FRUITS OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

LOVE (Charity) – JOY – PEACE – PATIENCE – KINDNESS – GOODNESS – FAITHFULNESS – GENTLENESS – SELF CONTROL MODESTY-CHASTITY-GENEROSITY

Generosity - The quality of being kind. Giving what you have out of love for others.

Charity (Love) - The giving of yourself, self-sacrificial love, loving God above all else and loving others for the sake of God.

Faithfulness - Giving God our belief, our trust, and through that trust, our actions.

Joy - Feeling of great happiness, the ultimate joy is to be experienced in heaven when we see God face to face.

Peace - A freedom from chaos and disruptions, a goal of the Christian life. It is a work of justice and charity and Christ calls us all to be peacemakers (Matthew 5:9).

Self-Control - The ability to control oneself, particularly one's emotions and desires and the responses to them, especially in difficult situations.

Chastity - Being able to properly and appropriately live out your sexuality through an inner unity of body and spirit. It takes different forms depending on one's state of life.

Modesty - Avoiding all forms of indecency and impurity, it protects the intimate center of the person, their body, and teaches respect of the human person. It is decency in all areas of life.

Gentleness - Not abusing your strength; it is the act of being kind and mild, to not act violently or severely.

Kindness - To show consideration and care, to do what is best for another even if that means standing up to that person with compassion and love.

Patience – To deal with annoyances or delays without complain or loss of temper, also quiet and steady perseverance and knowing when to act.

Goodness – Possessing values that are morally good or right, when something is good, it is of benefit or advantage for someone or something.

"Real Presence" of Christ in the Eucharist

The church means it as the whole Christ being truly present, body, blood, soul, and divinity, under the appearances of bread and wine–the glorified Christ who rose from the dead after dying for our sins.

"Amen, amen, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day. For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink. . . . Just as the living Father sent me and I have life because of the Father, so also the one who feeds on me will have life because of me" (Jn 6:53-57).

Holy Trinity

The Trinity is One. We confess one God in three persons. The Divine persons that are distinct from one another are: God, the Father God, the Son God, the Holy Spirit *The mystery of the Most Holy Trinity is the central mystery of Christian faith and life (CCC 234.)*
